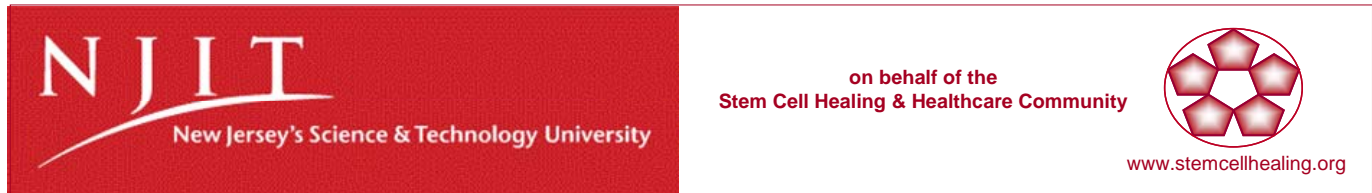

Despite potentially valid ethical, legal, religious and social questions regarding the use of embryonic stem cells for research and therapy, adult stem cells provide an attractive and ethically sound platform for improved treatment and possible cure of infants, children and adults suffering from a host of medical problems. Based on its strategic position in pharmaceuticals, biotechnology, medical devices, telecommunications, homeland security and transportation, New Jersey is uniquely positioned to serve as a regional nucleus for the development and globalization of stem cell research, education and therapy.
